

THE MORGAN HORSE BREEDING GUIDE

REGISTRAR'S REPORT

There has been much speculation about breeding activity since the economic downturn over the past decade. Here are the real statistics.

018 was an exciting year for the Morgan horse with a renewed enthusiasm. After watching a decline in the number of annual registrations since 2006, the AMHA Registry has experienced a growth in registrations for the last two years. In 2018, 25 percent more Morgan horses were

registered than in 2017. More important, as of December 31, 2018, AMHA registered 25 percent more foals born in 2018, than 2017 foals registered by December 31, 2017. Due to the registration fee structure change initiated in 2014, the number of older Morgan horses being registered has increased as well.

STALLIONS/MARES BRED

As of April 11, 2018, Stallion Service Reports for 522 stallions had been processed. This compared with 510 Stallion Service Reports that had been processed at this time in 2017, representing an increase of approximately 2.35 percent. Last year, the registry saw an increase of approximately 2.2 percent from the prior year.

2,040 mares were reported bred, compared to 1,881 mares at that time in 2017. This represents an increase of approximately 8.45

percent. Last year the Registry saw an increase of approximately 15.6 percent from the prior year.

When comparing the percentage of mares bred with foals from 2011 through 2015, the average percentage of mares with resulting foals is approximately 62 percent. Last year, the average of mares bred with foals from 2010 through 2014 was approximately 60 percent.

FOAL CROP

Over the last five years, the average percentage of foals registered for the preceding year, at the time the reports were run, was 70.88 percent.

For instance, as of April 13, 2017 there were 858 registered Morgans foaled in 2016, compared with 1,141 registered Morgans foaled in 2016 registered as of April 11, 2018.

The percentages of foal crop registered for the preceding year for the last five years were:

Using the average percent of 70.88 and the 2017 foal crop as of the report date of 936, we can estimate that the 2017 foal crop will be approximately 1,320. Last year, it was estimated that the 2016 foal crop would be approximately 1,266 and it is currently 1,141; the 2015 foal crop was estimated to be 1,154 and is currently 1,200.

COLOR

 Γ or those interested in color, the percentage of Morgan horses by color has remained fairly consistent over the years. There has been a slight increase in the number of black, bay, buckskin, cremello, and palomino horses being registered and a slight decrease in the number of chestnut horses being registered.
