REGISTRAR'S REPORT

Real information about the state of Morgan breeding activity.

The AMHA was very pleased with the support of the Morgan community in 2019. Registration numbers remained strong in 2019 after an increase in 2018 of 25 percent compared to 2017. This is great news for the Morgan horse as registrations had been experiencing a steady decline

from 2012 through 2017.


Transfers were slightly down in 2019, however AMHA processed the transfer requests (189 total) from the Superior Morgan Horse Sale in January rather than in December, when they are traditionally completed.

STALLIONS/MARES BRED

Ctallion Service Reports for 565 stallions were processed as of April 1, 2019. This compares with 522 Stallion Service Reports that had been processed at this time in 2018, representing an increase of approximately 8.24 percent. Last year we saw an increase of approximately 2.35 percent from the prior year.

2,332 mares were reported bred, compared to 2,040 mares at

that time in 2018. This represented an increase of approximately 14.31 percent. Last year we saw an increase of approximately 8.45 percent from the prior year.

When comparing the percentage of mares bred with foals registered from 2012 through 2016, the average percentage of mares with resulting registered foals was approximately 62 percent. This percentage has increased to approximately 64 as of April 10, 2019.

FOAL CROP

for the preceding year, at the time the reports were run, was 71.78 percent.

For instance, as of April 11, 2018 there were 936 registered Morgans foaled in 2017, compared with 1,301 registered Morgans foaled in 2017 registered as of April 10, 2018.

The percentages of foal crop registered for the preceding year for the last five years were:

Using the average of percent of 71.78 and the 2018 foal crop as of the report date of 1,158, we can estimate that the 2018 foal crop will be approximately 1,613. Last year, it was estimated that the 2017 foal crop would be approximately 1,320 and it is currently 1,301; the 2016 foal crop was estimated to be 1,266 and is currently 1,256.
